

Working Group Meeting: Strengthening Education in Healthcare Innovation

EIT Health Campus Degree Programmes

On November 15 2019, Prof. Hugo Alexandre Ferreira, coordinator of the Healthcare Innovation and Entrepreneurship Working Group, organizes in Lisbon, Portugal, an EIT Health Workshop to foster the development of EIT Master & Doctoral Degree Programmes as well as other educational offers within this theme. Registration is open to all academic and non-academic interested partners.

AIMS of the workshop:

- **Discuss** how current **societal trends** (e.g. ageing, digitization and connectedness, increase in medical literacy and environmental awareness, and raising healthcare costs) are driving the need for novel healthcare solutions, namely regarding **digital healthcare and medical devices**
- Discuss the **lack of professionals** with cross-disciplinary knowledge on both **design and healthcare**, capable of optimizing the design, development and translation of novel healthcare solutions, in collaboration with other professionals (e.g. engineers, healthcare professionals) and stakeholders.
- Kickstart the development of **Master and PhD programmes and curricula in Design in Healthcare and academic and non-academic consortia** to carry out such programmes.

This workshop is part of the Health Campus Degree Programmes Line. Within this activity, four on-going working groups foster collaboration between partners and support the development of unique Masters and PhDs covering the objectives of EIT Health. Moreover, the working groups support discussion for several training and educational offers, such as summer schools and short courses. Interested partners are encouraged to take part in the degree activities and join the relevant thematic working groups:

I.	Innovation and Entrepreneurship in Healthy Living and Active Ageing (including self-management)
II.	Technological Innovation for Health (including bioengineering, diagnostics)
III.	Healthcare Innovation and Entrepreneurship (including management in cancer, cognitive decline and other chronic conditions)
IV.	Health and Medical Data Analytics

Accommodation

A variety of accommodations is available in Lisbon. You may want to be in the city center or more iconic historical and trendy locations in Alfa, Bairro Alto, Chiado, Castelo, Mouraria, or Parque das Nações (see e.g. <https://www.lisbonlux.com/lisbon/bairros.html>).

A convenient accommodation just 5 min walk from the Venue is Radisson Blu Hotel Lisbon, but various offers exist, including Airbnb, of different price ranges.

Transport

Teclabs is at <10 min drive from Lisbon Airport.

If you arrive at Terminal 1 you may take the taxi, bus, or subway at Arrivals exit, otherwise you can take Uber, Bolt, Kapten, Cabify or Izzy Move at Departures of Terminal 1. This latter option is recommended.

If you're flying low-cost you'll most probably arrive at Terminal 2. Here you may take the taxi or Uber, Bolt, Kapten, Cabify or Izzy Move. Otherwise you can take an airport bus to Terminal 1 and make your way there (see above). Using Uber and Uber-like services is recommended.
