Manuscripts related to oral and poster presentations at a conference

Accreditation and Quality Assurance (ACQUAL) is a journal for Quality, Comparability and Reliability in Chemical Measurement and as such it focuses on Metrology in Chemistry. For more detailed information please read "Aims and Scope" at www.springer.com/769

Each conference related manuscript is subject to peer reviewing under the same quality demands as any other submission. ACQUAL does not publish "proceedings" in the traditional sense of a conference panorama. Each article will carry a label stating its presentation at the conference.

Particularly suitable sections are "General Papers" addressing scientific achievements and perspectives, "Practitioner's Reports" on experiences of general interest to the journal's community, and critical "Reviews" (all three of them equally rated by ISI Web of Science). The section "Discussion Forum" is intended to stimulate the exchange of views on contentious matters and unorthodox ideas.

Please note the Instructions "For authors and editors" accessible via ACQUAL's homepage www.springer.com/769 and browse recent issues of the journal. ACQUAL expects the authors to comply with the International Vocabulary of Metrology ("VIM3", <http://www.bipm.org/vim>) and conventions as outlined in the SI brochure or the IUPAC Green Book (3rd edn., 2007).

Quite typically, articles in ACQUAL comprise 3000-6000 words (20000-40000 characters filling 4-8 printed pages). If larger amounts of data, such as individual results or raw data etc. are scientifically necessary, they can be provided as Electronic Supplementary Material which is directly linked to the article online version.

Manuscripts submitted before the due-date are considered to be printed in the same issue of the journal - manuscripts received later may be included in a subsequent issue.
